MUSEUM OF FLYING



Donald W. Douglas founded his aircraft manufacturing empire in Santa Monica just 17 years after the Wright brothers' first flight in 1903. In 1924, his Douglas World Cruisers were the first aircraft to circumnavigate the globe, and, in 1933, he introduced his famed DC series of passenger planes that again revolutionized air travel. The monument onsite is comprised of a restored DC-3 and a lifesize statue of Douglas by resident sculptor Yossi Govrin.
